General Informations

The Doctorate Programme Contemporary Turkish Dialects and Literatures of Niğde Ömer Halisdemir University opened in 2020.

This program consists of course and thesis stage. In order to complete the program, the student must complete a total of 240 credits, thirty credits per semester. Lessons to be taken during the course are optional, one of the courses in the first semester must be a research method and one of the courses in the second semester must be a seminar. After the lecture period, the proficiency exam is done.

At the department of Contemporary Turkish Dialects and Literatures, one is 2 Professor Drs., one is a foreign national 4 Assistant Professor Drs. and a foreign national 3 PhD work. At the department scientific studies are done intensively.

The students and education members of Department collaborate and exchange with many domestic and foreign countries under the program of Erasmus and Farabi.

Niğde Ömer Halisdemir University examinations are conducted according to Niğde Ömer Halisdemir University Graduate Education-Examination and Examination Regulations in accordance with the student workload in Bologna process.

Aims and Objectives:

Aims:

To educate individuals who can use the knowledge they have learned at the major fields of Contemporary Turkish Dialects and Literatures in their vocational life, and who can propose solution for the problems related to the field and who can manage these solutions successfully, and who have developed social skills, and who have the concious of communal thought not individual thought.

Objectives:

Our department's main objectives are to increase the number of scientific researches by giving contemporary and modern education and to educate students who tend to do research and observings in the level of making national and international Projects.

Qualification Awarded

Upon successful completion of this program, students are awarded with the qualification of DOCTORATE DEGREE in CONTEMPORARY TURKISH DIALECTS AND LITERATURES.

<u>Level</u>

Doctorate Degree with thesis in CONTEMPORARY TURKISH DIALECTS AND LITERATURES is a two-year (4 semesters) program with 240 ECTS credits. The program meets the requirements both for ECTS credits and level descriptors of the "Second Cycle" degree qualifications of the Overarching Framework of European Qualifications Framework HE (QF-EHEA) and the "7th Level" qualifications of the Turkish Qualifications Framework for HE (TYYÇ, NQF-HETR), as well as the "7th Level"

requirements of the qualifications of the European Qualifications Framework for Lifelong Learning

(EQF-LLL) in terms of the level descriptors.

Admission Requirements

Admission requirements are determined in line with the regulations set by Higher Education Council

of Turkey. Information on application for graduate programs and access requirements are announced

on the web page of the university at the beginning of each academic year.

• To have ALES (Entrance Exam for Academic Personnel and Postgraduate Education)

with minimum score of 80 (or equivalent) whose to have a First Cycle (BSc) degree

and with minimum score of 65 (or equivalent) whose to have a Second Cycle

(Master's) degree.

To have a cumulative grade point average (CGPA) of at least 80 out of 100 whose to

have a First Cycle (BSc) degree and to have a cumulative grade point average (CGPA)

of at least 80 out of 100 whose to have a Second Cycle (Master's) degree.

• Determining the validity period of ALES score is based on the period determined by YÖK.

At least 55 points from the international foreign language exams accepted by the Higher

Education Council other than the mother tongue of the candidates who apply for doctoral / art

proficiency programs, or the international foreign language accepted as equivalent by the

Center for Measurement, Selection and Placement (ÖSYM) they must have received a point

equivalent to this score.

Profile of the Programme

Contemporary Turkish Dialects and Literatures Doctoral Program has been established with a mission to provide the students a high quality program to follow and use educational technologies and at the same time to participate actively in applied and theoretical research.

The doctorate program is designed in accordance with a cooperative education strategy and an understanding of hands-on experience, so that the new trends in the educational technology can be adapted easily. Thus it is aimed to provide the students the skills to apply the knowledge of social problems; to understand different areas of Contemporary Turkish Dialects and Literatures and to specialize at least in one of them; and to participate in creative and integrative design activities as well. Undergraduate (Bachelor's Degree) program in Contemporary Turkish Dialects and Literatures (First Cycle in QF-EHEA and 6th level in TYYÇ) is an academically-oriented program giving access to degree and non-degree research program and professional practice demanding high levels of knowledge and skills. Qualification Requirements and Regulations

Doctoral program in CONTEMPORARY TURKISH DIALECTS AND LİTERATURES is awarded to students who have scored a Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA) of not less than 3.00 /4.00, defended his/her thesis successfully, and have completed all the courses (240 ECTS) with at least a letter grade of BB or S in the program.

Examination Regulations, Assessment and Grading

The methods used to measure whether the program learning outcomes foreseen during the Contemporary Turkish Dialects and Literatures program are achieved are given below. Outputs for

course units are shown along with the contribution they provide to the final grades in the part of the course description

- Final Exam
- Make-up Exam

Exams:

Mid-term and final examinations are conducted in dates, places and times determined and announced by the University. The students' final semester grade is given by their instructors based on mid-term examination, homework evaluation, final examination and, if there is any other assessment results taking into account the students' compliance with attendance to the course activities.

The contribution of assessment grades of the in-term activities to the final grade is 40% and that of the final exam is 60% for all the course units.

Grading:

The success of a student for each assessment (in-term and final) defined for each course unit is evaluated by the instructor. Evaluations are made over a scale of 100 points and converted to the letter grades at the end of the semester. A student is considered to be successful in a course if he/she gets one of the following grades: AA, BA, BB or S (successful). The student's academic standing is calculated in the form of a Grade Point Average (GPA) out of a scale of 4.00 and announced at the end of each semester. The total grade point of a course is obtained by multiplying the grade point by the course ECTS credit. The semester GPA is calculated by dividing the total amount of grade points of courses gained in that semester by the total amount of ECTS credits of courses taken in the semester. The yearlong courses are included in the spring semester GPA. Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA) is calculated by dividing the total amount of grade points of all the courses in the curriculum to be taken by the total amount of 240 ECTS credits. For each course taken, the student is given one of the following letter grades and grade points:
