Department of Coaching Education

General Information

The Department of Coaching Education has started its graduate education under the umbrella of Niğde Ömer Halisdemir University, Institute of Health Sciences since 2019.

This program consists of lecture and thesis phase. In order for the student to complete the program, it is required to complete a total of one hundred and twenty credits, thirty credits per semester. The courses to be taken during the course phase are elective and it is obligatory to take the "Research Methods" course in the first semester and the "Seminar" course in the second semester. The thesis phase consists of special topics and thesis work. In addition, graduate students can continue their education in European Union countries thanks to the bilateral agreements made within the framework of the Erasmus program.

Department of Coaching Education 1 Professor Dr., 2 Associate Professors, 3 Dr. Lecturer It serves with its member. In addition, it has a young, dynamic and competent academic staff consisting of 2 research assistants who continue their doctorate education according to the article 50 / d. Our department has Movement and Training Sciences Division. Department students and lecturers collaborate and exchange with many domestic and foreign countries within the scope of the Erasmus and Farabi program.

Exams for graduate courses at Niğde Ömer Halisdemir University are conducted in the Bologna process in accordance with the student workload, according to the Niğde Ömer Halisdemir University Graduate Education and Examination regulations.

Aims and Goals

Aims:

The aim of Coaching Education Master's Program is; Contributing to the developments in contemporary sports science technologies, following the developments in this field, having an investigative and analytical mindset, respectful of human values that can lead the society in changing world conditions, adopting modern sports training methods who are aware of the importance of sports in terms of public health, and aims to train experts.

Goals:

The main goals of our department are; To become a leader in academic ranking in national and international movement and training sciences and to conduct academic research and publications to develop theories and practices. To train scientists in the fields of movement and training who are equipped with the necessary scientific and social skills, who can follow the trainings at the next level, who have critical thinking and leadership skills in the environments they will work, who can provide interdisciplinary cooperation, who can produce innovative and original solutions.

Given Degree

Students who successfully complete the program are awarded a Master's Degree in the Department of Coaching Education.

Level

The Master of Coaching Education Program is a 2-year (4 semesters) program consisting of 120 ECTS credits. The program is determined for the "First Cycle" defined in the "European Qualifications Higher Education Framework (QF-EHEA)" of the Bologna Process and "Level 7" qualifications defined in the "Turkish Higher Education Qualifications Framework (TYYÇ)". ECTS credit requirements and level qualifications; It also provides the "Level 7" qualifications defined in the "European Lifelong Learning Qualifications Framework (EQF-LLL)".

Admission Requirements

Admission conditions are decided in accordance with the regulations set by the Turkish Higher Education Council. Information on application and requirements for admission to graduate programs is announced on the university website at the beginning of each academic year. The following conditions are valid for both Turkish and foreign students:

- Having a bachelor's degree in Coaching Education, Physical Education and Sports, Sports Sciences and Technology Schools and Physical Education and Sports Teaching Departments of Education Faculties
- At least 55 points (or equivalent) from ALES (Academic Personnel and Postgraduate Education Entrance Exam)
- YDS (Foreign Language Proficiency Exam) at the national level, ÜDS (Interuniversity Board Foreign Language Exam) or KPDS (Public Personnel Language Exam) or IELTS (International English Test System) or TOEFL (as a Foreign Language) at the international level accepted by the Interuniversity Board. English Exam) to be proficient in foreign language exams. Students who do not have foreign language proficiency can apply, but their score in this area will be evaluated as zero.
- Candidates who have obtained a Bachelor's Degree abroad are required to obtain a equivalence certificate from the Council of Higher Education.
- ALES score is valid for 5 years.
- Candidates must apply in person. Applications made with missing documents will not be evaluated.

Occupational Profiles of Graduates with Examples

Most of the time, those who have graduated from the Coaching Education Master's Program can apply to the doctoral program. In addition, graduates can become teachers, and they can also be employed in the central organization and provincial organizations of the Ministry of Youth and Sports and the General Directorate of Sports as Coach and Spotif Education Specialist.

Qualification Criteria and Regulations

It is given to students who have a General Academic Grade Point Average (GANO) not less than 2.5 / 4.00 from the Coaching Education Master's program, who have successfully defended their thesis and who have passed all the courses in the program (120 ECTS) with at least CB or S grade.

Academic Advancement Opportunities

Students who successfully complete this program can apply to the Department of Coaching Education Department or to doctoral programs in the fields related to the Department. Students who successfully complete the doctorate program can work as academicians at universities and have a professional career.

Exam Regulations, Assessment and Grading System

The methods used to measure whether the program learning outcomes for the duration of the Coaching Training program have been achieved or not are listed below. The outputs of the course units are shown in the section of the course description, together with its contribution to the final grades.

Exams:

Midterm and final exams are held on the dates, places and times determined and announced by the university. The final grades of the students are given by the lecturers based on the midterm exam, homework evaluation, final exam results and also taking into account the attendance requirement of the students.

Evaluation:

The success of a student is evaluated by the instructor for each assessment (in-term and final) defined for each course. The assessment is based on 100 full points.

A student who gets AA, BA, BB, CB and S (Successful) from a course is considered successful. Students' success status; Semester academic average and general academic averages are calculated over 4.00 and announced at the end of each semester. The multiplication of the coefficient of the credit of a course and the success grade obtained from that course gives the weighted score of that course. The academic average of the semester is calculated by dividing the sum of the weighted points of the courses in that semester by the total credits of the courses. Annual courses are included in the spring semester academic average. The general academic average is calculated by dividing the total of the weighted points to be calculated on the basis of the grades taken from all the courses the student has to take during the period of study by the total credits of the courses taken (240 ECTS for those applying to the program with a Master's degree and 300 ECTS for those applying with a bachelor's degree). Graduation Requirements

In order for a student to graduate from the Master's Program, the following conditions must be met:

• Completing 120 ECTS credits with a passing grade (54 ECTS credits for 7 graduate courses, 6 ECTS credits for the Seminar Course, 20 ECTS credits for 2 Special Field Courses and 40 ECTS credits for Thesis Studies for 2 consecutive semesters).
