

General Information

After the establishment of Ömer Halisdemir University in 1992, Master's Degree and Doctoral Degree programs launched in 1996 in the Department of History in Medieval History and Modern History branches at the Institute of Social Sciences. Department of History enables the education of the Master Degree Program with thesis from 2014 education year.

Various research and training studies are carried out in the context of Turkish History, Culture and Civilization and its relations with other nations and cultures. Also the department aims to train individuals who are interrogator, participatory, dynamic and regards national values and think universally, to serve humanity enabling the education of individuals in the mentioned areas and contribute to the country's unity and integrity and the region's social and cultural development.

Our department aims to contribute to the social sciences using questioning, exploratory and critiqued edition of materials and taking into account the position of the Turkish history in the history of the world in a simultaneous approach of the Turkish history, culture and civilization and in the field of relations with the other nations and cultures and ensure students gain this scientific approach.

The maximum completion time for Master's Degree with thesis in Department of History, (for detailed information " Ömer Halisdemir University Graduate Education and Examination Regulations" Article 36 should be consulted). Institute of Social Sciences, Department of History has a young, dynamic and competent academic staff housing a professor, 3 associated professor and 7 assistant professors.

Students are required to complete a total of 120 credits in order to graduate from the Master's Degree of the Department of History.

Aims and Objectives

Aims:

To know all the methods of research and investigation within the scope of the science of history, carry out scientific research independently using the methods of research and investigation, to be appropriate and suitable for effective cooperation between other disciplines and have the potential, be sensitive to protection and maintenance of, culture, art, and natural assets, have contemporary thinking skills, provide practical solutions to solve a problem in the field of history and have the ability to successfully manage these solutions, have awareness to look at the events from a social perspective as well as the individual perspective.

Objectives:

The main objectives of the department is to train the historians of the future to deal with the problems, needs and deficiencies that will arise in the field of the different periods and processes as researchers, academics, teachers, and etc., gain knowledge and different perspectives, develop analytical thinking skills, train high-quality and well-equipped students, raise individuals who are full of love for the country and the nation, regard the country's interests over the interests of themselves, determined, devoted and responsible, guide students

to research and study, increase creativity and productivity and train students with an inquisitive, exploratory, creative, and integrative perspective.

Qualification Awarded

Upon successful completion of this program, students are awarded with the qualification of MASTER OF SCIENCE DEGREE in HISTORY.

Master's Degree with thesis of the Department of History, is a 3-year 120 ECTS program.

Admission Requirements

The candidates who apply to Master's Degree programs in the Department of History must have an appropriate Bachelor's degree. They are required to take an ALES score of 55 at least or an equivalent score of GMAT or GRE determined by the Council of Higher Education.

Undergraduate graduation grade point average and ALES score and if available foreign language score is considered in admittance to Master's Degree programs. Foreign language is not a prerequisite to apply graduate programs, in calculation language foreign language score is assumed to be zero. Master's degree entrance success grade is the sum of 35% of Bachelor's Degree graduation grade point average, 50% of the ALES score and 15% of foreign language score.

- Completed minimum 7 courses, seminar and specialization field courses and thesis studies.
- Completed 120 ECTS credits with passing grades.
- A cumulative grade point average (CGPA) of at least 2.50 out of 4.00.

Examination Regulations, Assessment and Grading

The methods applied for assessment of the achievement of the expected program learning outcomes for the program of Master’s Degree with thesis of History are shown below and those for the individual course units are given in the relevant section of the course description with their contribution to the final grades.

Examinations:

Mid-term and final examinations are conducted in dates, places and times determined and announced by the University. The student cannot take one-course exam.

Examinations of graduate courses are evaluated out of 100 and for each course at least one midterm examination is given each semester. Midterm / final / make-up exams can be done in writing or assessed regarding the prepared the assignments and practical works during the semester.

Success grade of Master's degree courses is the sum of 40% of midterm exam and 60% of final exam and this score must be at least 75.

Evaluation:

The success of a student for each assessment (in-term and final) defined for each course unit is evaluated by the instructor. Evaluations are made over a scale of 100 points and converted to the letter grades at the end of the semester taking into account the standard deviation of grades and grade point average of the class and using the relative evaluation method, principles of which have been set by the Senate. To be considered successful in a course, the Master's degree students are required to take 75 out of 100.
